Reader's Workshop

This week students will use the mentor text, Animal Tongues by Dawn Cusick to learn how to stop and use "fix-up" strategies when what they are reading does not make sense. They will also learn how to reread the text and use strategies to uncover the meaning of unfamiliar words or phrases. We will also review how to use problem/solution text structures to focus our attention when reading and deepen our understanding.

Writer's Workshop

This week students will use the mentor text, Are You A Snail? By Judith Allen to distinguish characteristics of nonfiction writing. We will also explore how one author examines their subjects deeply. Students will also work with our Media Specialist Mrs. Lynch to finish typing our narratives and dedication page/about the author as well as use the book-creating app to transform our weekend news into a collected digital book. ©
